Painted Lady

As a caterpillar, a painted lady is black in color. Later in life, they turn into a butterfly with reddish-orange, black, and white coloration and are about 1.5 - 2 inches in size.





A hard shell-like protective layer created during the metamorphosis stage where a caterpillar is transitioning into a butterfly.



Beetle

A beetle may vary in coloration and size ranging from brown to black and reaching up to 1.5 inches. They are insects with 6 legs.



Roly Poly

Also known as a pill bug, a roly poly is brown to grey in coloration. They are oval shaped and typically half an inch long. When threatened, they can be seen rolled up!



As a caterpillar, a monarch has black, white, and yellow stripes. Later in life, they turn into a butterfly with orange, black, and white coloration and are about 4 inches in size.
